

Hebrew – The Pure Language

Zephaniah 3:8 is the only verse in the TaNaCh where every Hebrew letter including the sofits are represented.

“Therefore wait ye upon me, saith the LORD, until the day that I rise up to the prey: for my determination is to gather the nations, that I may assemble the kingdoms, to pour upon them mine indignation, *even* all my fierce anger: for all the earth shall be devoured with the fire of my jealousy.” [Zep 3:8 KJV](#)

Hebrew Aleph Bet

On the first row of this table is the 22 Hebrew letters plus the 5 sofits (shaded in grey). The second row is a sequential set of numbers representing each Hebrew letter. Those letters that have sofits are represented as a real number with a decimal of one (e.g. mem is 13 and the mem sofit is 13.1). These numbers are used in the figure above as a way to map all the Hebrew letters.

Zep 3:9 For then will I turn to the people a pure language, that they may all call upon the name of the LORD, to serve him with one consent.
